#### **IV. KIDS & TEENS 519 Christmas Wish List**

When I first started out in ministry I was told to pray this every year: "Attempt something so great for God it is doomed for failure unless he is in it!" So pray with us (Ann and Steve) as we look toward spending more time in Kenya and our partner countries in the future.

1. World Sport Ministries: To train more coaches and to partner with the local church in spreading the Gospel through sports to the unreached areas of Kenya and for equipment, travel, etc. Goal is \$10,000
2. Siloamu Children's Centre (This is one of the slums we visited): For teaching 100 pupils. They have asked for money for books, Bibles, desks, chairs, and construction material for more classrooms as well as salaries for their teachers. Goal is \$5000.00
3. U-turn performing Arts: To launch two pilot plays for the community by the youths from the community concerning values that will empower youth in making decisions and elicit behavioral changes. Steve met with these teens and his heart is to empower them to achieve this. Goal: \$200.00
4. Edken Finish: For replacement of tools lost after the 2007 Kenya election in which there was looting of property and many losses. Goal: \$5000.00. This will also help employ people in the slums.
5. Seed money to start orphanage & health center near Mombasa that when Ann retires to go into full time ministry to serve there. 2 Buildings & 4 acres \$60,000.
6. A donated vehicle for World Sport Ministry for Kenya Transportation: First of all we give thanks for the William and Mama June's Toyota (meant for five but usually carrying 7 people+). It was efficient in our travel throughout Nairobi, to the 32 partner churches and agencies we work with. What is needed is a four wheel drive vehicle for the World Sports Ministry in Nairobi and one for Mombasa.

#### **2009 Ministry Report**

To our supporter, friends and intercessors:

Blessings to you and thank you for your prayers and support. We believe there is nothing more important in this age than investing your life in others. So as we approach this next stage of life as many of you know Ann will officially retire in December. After 30 years of ministry and working for children and family services for the state of Illinois.

Despite dramatic changes in our life, we understand the vision from the Lord clearer than ever before. God put a burden in my heart in 1995 to not just multiply camps in the US but to go to all the nations. Our first partner was in Russia and since that time we have prayed to God and he has provided more partners (the Global Sports Partnership, World Sport Ministry, Revival Sports, Fellowship of Christian Athletes, Athletes in Action-Netherlands, WSM Kenya, and the local churches) in our sphere of influence. Our partnerships have expanded to Nepal, England and the 20 Burroughs in London, the Netherlands, China, 27 Russian speaking countries, Thailand, India and 6 countries in central Africa where the Gospel is being proclaimed and lives changed.

The mission of our life is to train and equip active and non-active members of the church to be effective in evangelism, discipleship, and church planting in the 10|40 window region, Russia, Africa, United Kingdom, and the U.S. by using the Bible and the universal language of sports & camps God has a plan for us.

He wants us to build a sustainable partnership through God's ministries, churches, and people who want to be a part of what God is doing in these parts of the world. Every day when we wake up we understand that we do not have the abilities to accomplish this dream. However, God always encourages us.

He needs us empty, insufficient, and useless in order to show His grace and power in every project of the ministry. It is an honor for us to be tools in God's hands. We are so thankful for each of you. You are our heroes who show unity in the Body of Christ by impacting nations in the last days before His coming. We will celebrate the victory together!

Kids and Teens 519 and our partners have developed a practical approach which helps us to establish sustainable teams of Jesus' witnesses on the sport-field & in churches in Central Asia, Africa, UK, USA, Russia Federation and Eastern Europe.

We operate as a non-denominational and non-profit ministry to churches in order to be a successful witness in the modern society. The approach is simple as 1.2.3

1. Training: We use a unique way of training leaders so they can get not only the best Biblical foundation and theory of sports and camp ministry, but also test it during practical exercises. When leaders leave the training, they are ready to apply the knowledge that they received. Through our training, we help non-active believers in the church become effective leaders on the mission field.

2. Impacting: Global Sports Partnership and Global Community Games (GCG) is a strategy for local church leaders to impact society through four phases: Kid Games, Teen Games, Edge Games (for single adults and students) and Family Games. GCG serves as a catalytic event which draws the community together for relationship development. By using this strategy, leaders are able to befriend participants and as a result, invite them to faith in Jesus Christ. Max 7 and Whole Life Coaching are follow-through programs which allow us to teach new generations how to live life in maximum with Jesus 7 days a week,

3. Establishing: Camps, mission trips, and major sporting events provide the opportunities to develop sustainable teams, starting at the country level and ending at city or church level. Each team is a group of volunteers who commit their life to ministry and represent the development of specific strategic programs. Each team is a part of discipleship process which brings them to the level of multiplication and the reproduction of other ministry teams in different parts of countries we serve.

### **Missions Report: Multiplying and training leaders and missions trips: Kenya (3 trips), England, Guatemala, Netherlands, and Orlando.**

KAT519 & Director, Steve Wiegand, fulfilled many 2009 ministry goals with Grant Sheppard & World Sports Ministry trustees, staff, servant leaders and coaches in England & Kenya. WSM is headquartered in Bath, England and provides training for partner organizations in Pakistan, Kenya, Africa and the United Kingdom. World Sports Ministries is a tax exempt charitable organization in both Kenya and England serving under the local churches in those partner countries.

Many of you have donated time, talents, treasures and prayers for training 238 coaches, 568 scholarships in soccer, cricket, rugby and basketball camps that 3728 kids and their families participated in 2009.

## **2009 ComeBack Kids Camp Report**

This year we had 27 campers, four of which were training as junior teen counselors. There were six campers who made Jesus their Lord and Savior. Our goal is always to love the campers unconditionally, but sadly enough some of them are unable to accept that kind of love. One camper approached Ann asking to speak to her. She hung her head, covering her eyes with her hair and said that she did not know how to put it in words. After a little encouragement, she indicated that she and her counselor were not connecting. When asked why she thought that they were not connecting, she responded, "she's too sweet. She tells me I'm special." It was sad to hear that she did not think she was special and apparently did not feel she deserved to be treated sweetly. She then raised her eyes and matter of fact stated "you know, Ann, I need boundaries." Ann couldn't disagree with that as we all need boundaries, but Ann challenged her thinking. She knew if nothing else this camper had to know that she was special and that the counselor was just telling her those sweet things that someday she will hear from Jesus. She was encouraged to accept the sweetness just during this week of camp. This camper tried a few tricks in an attempt to elicit rejection from her sweet counselor by "trash" talking, but the Counselor never gave up on her and the camper left grinning ear to ear and embracing a new belief that she truly was special in the eyes of God.

As part of the curriculum the Jesus video (children's version) was used. Every night before they went to bed they got to view a 20 minute segment of it. It appeared to have a powerful impact as every night they were eager to view it and did not want it to stop. The video was given to each camper to take home with them in the princess backpack they were given at the Princess Party. We pray they will share it with their friends and be a part of the Great Commission.

They also were given a MP3 with at least 50 Christian Songs on them. With all the things in the world that they could put in their ears we believe this was a good tool for them to combat many of the wrong things they hear. It is our hope that the impact of the camp would continue in their daily lives through the MP3 songs and Jesus video.

Half the volunteers this year were first timers but you would have never known that by observing. We were blessed with a great team of counselors and staff that all worked well together to make camp not just fun but also a safe and cozy atmosphere full of love and compassion for one another. The volunteers were from several different churches and most of them did not know each other prior to making the commitment to volunteer at the camp. Thirty-five volunteers unknown to each other in harmony for one week is a God ordained miracle especially during those difficult moments when things did not go as planned.

ComeBack Kids Camp also serves as a training field for teens to become leaders. The teen counselors are teamed up with an adult counselor so they can work as a team in providing the love and care these foster girls need. One teen counselor described her experience as follows: "...it really strengthened my trust in God because there were definitely times when I really needed to trust God. It was an amazing experience because God worked right in front of me and even possibly through me!" We look forward to ComeBack Kids Camp 2010 and we already have the dates and place. ComeBack Kids Camp 2010 will be at East Bay Camp from July 23- July 31.
